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# THE HAMILTON DRIVE ASSOCIATION

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### CONSTITUTION (as revised to June 1994)

1. The Association shall be called the 'Hamilton Drive Association'.
2. The aims of the Association shall be to preserve and improve the amenity of the local area.
3. Those eligible for membership shall be all owners or tenants of Hamilton Drive, Hamilton Park Avenue, Buckingham Street/Terrace, Queen Margaret Drive between Great Western Road and Hamilton Drive, Ruskin Lane, and Ruskin Place/Terrace, together with their families and, at the discretion of the Committee, any other persons interested in the aims of the Association. Not more than four persons from any residence or place of business shall be entitled to membership of the Association.
4. The affairs of the Association shall be directed by a Committee which shall normally consist of nine members including a Convenor, Vice-Convenor, Treasurer and Secretary, who shall be elected by the Association at a General Meeting. The Committee shall have power to co-opt additional members. For Committee meetings there shall be a quorum of five. No Committee member shall serve for more than three years and none may seek re-election until at least a further year has passed. One-third of the members of the Committee shall retire each year and nominations for the new Committee shall be received by the Secretary.
5. There shall be an annual subscription the amount of which shall be approved at a General Meeting on the recommendation of the Committee.
6. The financial year of the Association shall end on the last day of March and the Annual General Meeting of the Association will be held within three months of that date. Additional General Meetings may be called at any time by the Committee or by at least twenty members of the Association. At a General Meeting fifteen members of the Association shall constitute a quorum. Only members of the Association shall be entitled to a vote at a General Meeting.
7. Any alternation of the constitution must be approved by a General Meeting by a two-thirds majority of those members present. Fourteen days' notice of the proposed alterations shall be given to members.
8. In the event of the Association being wound up all moneys belonging to the Association shall be disposed of by the resolution of a General Meeting to a body or bodies having aims similar to those of this Association.
